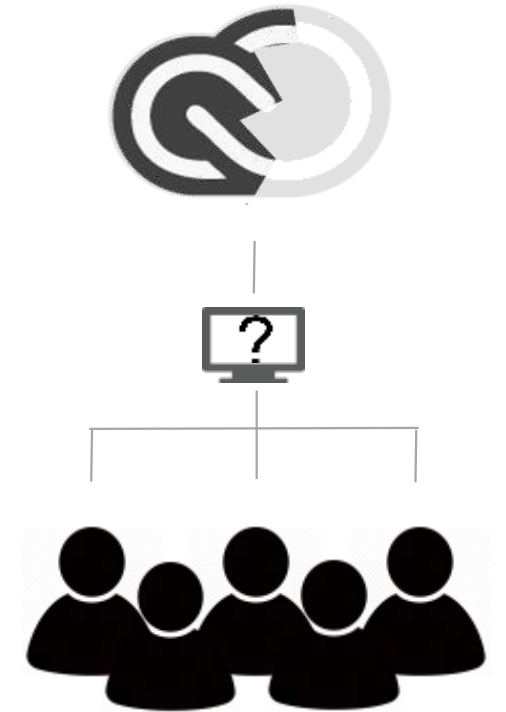

Limitations of Device Licensing

- Certain functionality not available without services
- No access to storage, requiring 3rd party services
- No access to Portfolio to showcase work
- No access to cloud-based apps
- License conflict when named-users attempt to use entitled devices
- No admin visibility into usage volumes

This document is intended to walk higher education institutions through the deployment of shared device licenses of Adobe Spark (English only), All Apps, or other Adobe products to students, teachers, and faculty.

Shared device licenses allow you, as the IT admin in your institution, to deploy Creative Cloud apps and services to specific devices. For example, you can install Creative Cloud apps in your computer labs to allow students and teachers, with access to these computers, to use the apps and services that are available as part of your license agreement with Adobe.

This document is a step-by-step guide on how to set up your users and deploy apps and services to the devices in your computer labs. However, there is more detailed information on Adobe Admin Console and on each of the steps in the [Enterprise user documentation](#).

 - Share anything they want to file, and to file, any time, anywhere.

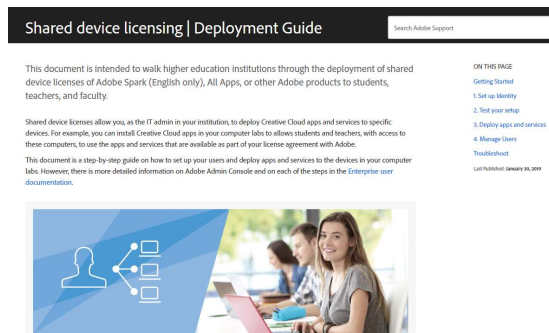
